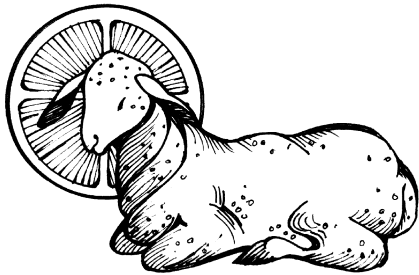

### **CEMETERY REGULATIONS - Part 4**

To avoid misunderstandings, it has been suggested that we publish the regulations governing our cemeteries. This is the fourth part: MEMORIALS

1. This is a Catholic cemetery. To keep its distinctly religious nature, only Christian symbols are permitted on the memorials.
  2. Scenes depicting a decedent’s occupation, hobbies, interests, fraternal associations, and so on, are not appropriate.
  3. The depiction of animals as found in Sacred Scripture is appropriate if the scripture verse is used with it to show that it is of a religious nature.
  4. A marker may be placed at the foot of the grave for military, fire, medical, or Catholic organizations only.
  5. One line of script may be placed under the deceased’s name on the headstone in recognition of public service.
  6. All memorials [markers and headstones] must be approved in advance by the parish office. Requests for approval are to be presented with the standard parish form including specifications, inscriptions, and detailed diagrams.
  7. All memorials are to be finished in accordance with trade standards and good craftsmanship. They must be in proportion to the size of the lot. Their foundations must be installed by qualified bonded contractors under the supervision of cemetery personnel as directed by St. Joseph Parish.
  8. Memorials that have been placed without permission or which fail to conform to the specifications as approved will be removed by the dealer, otherwise the St. Joseph Parish reserves the right to remove it at the expense of the dealer.
  9. Monument dealers and outside contractors are considered independent contractors and are to be bonded for work in the cemetery. St. Joseph Parish is not responsible for defects in memorials or foundations caused by the monument dealer.
  10. St. Joseph Parish is not liable for damages arising from vandalism, natural disasters, public unrest, or any cause beyond the reasonable control of management.
- For copies of the complete regulations, please contact the parish office.

- *Please know that we are aware that many of these rules have not been adhered to in the past. We are doing our best to deal with and fix the issues that we can now and to ensure that all rules and regulations will be followed by everyone from here on forward.*

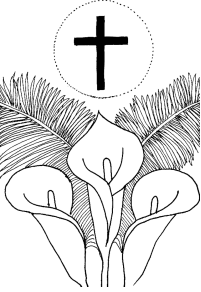

REJOICE AND BE GLAD

If Christmas is the “most wonderful time of the year,” then Easter is the most joyous, glorious, awesome time of the year! Really? Today’s readings don’t exactly brim over with the kind of holiday cheer we find at Christmas—except for the responsorial psalm, which admittedly rings with gleeful joy. But otherwise, not so much. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter gives a dry, condensed rendering of the story of Jesus to a group of Gentiles in Caesarea. The Colossians reading actually does have us looking forward to glory. Most underwhelming, though, is the Gospel proclamation of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. When we want to hear about angels and earthquakes and trumpets and glory, we hear about a dark, silent, empty tomb. This Easter Sunday story from John’s Gospel is startling in its emptiness. Like Peter in the story, we must enter into this mystery.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH - Easter Season

Our Easter celebration lasts fifty days, during which Resurrection joy should overflow the hearts of believers to refresh a parched and weary world with the revivifying waters of faith, hope, and charity. All season, at every Sunday Mass, we read Luke’s Acts of the Apostles, charting the young church’s Spirit-led journey, sometimes peaceful, sometimes persecuted, beset by enemies without and turmoil within. But this young church is always moving onward, from Jerusalem’s familiarity to the strangeness of every place between there and Rome; and outward, from an inherited Judaism’s comfortable uniformity to the Gentile world’s challenging diversity. A week after Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday invites us to renew our personal relationship with Jesus. On the Third Sunday of Easter, the disciples at Emmaus recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread, and return to share the Good News even as modern-day disciples should. On Good Shepherd Sunday, the church prays for priestly and religious vocations. All the while, Acts shows people drawn to the early Church because they had seen the Risen Jesus not in person, but in persons, in disciples who still form Christ’s living Body, the Church. Each of us is likewise called to be the kind of disciple, personally and in communion with our brothers and sisters, in whom those who seek Jesus may at least glimpse his presence.

**APRIL 9, 2023**

“When Jesus had risen, early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had driven seven demons.” (Mark 16:9) Popular Catholic piety sometimes posits that the newly risen Jesus appears first to the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a happy thought, but it’s simply not what the scriptures report. We are told quite directly that he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, “out of whom he had driven seven demons.” Why would the gospel writer remind us of this unsavory detail of Mary’s past? Historians tell us women were not qualified to give legal testimony. On top of that, to be possessed by not just one, but seven demons, is unsavory and terrifying. What damage had they done to her? What did she do to allow herself to be home to such evil? It doesn’t seem to matter. Jesus chose Mary Magdalene to be the first one who saw him risen from the dead. He decided she was qualified. Do you think that you are disqualified from seeing and announcing the risen Jesus because of your past demons? Maybe they are the demons of despair, confusion, selfhatred, pride, addiction, failure, boredom, laziness, or other sins. Well, don’t. In the light of the Risen Jesus, all these past demons make our witness that much more believable — only if we allow ourselves to be touched by the liberating hand of Christ, just as Mary Magdalene did.
