Caryll Houselander, in her enlightening work "The Reed of God," prompts a profound query that resonates with many: Does the Advent experience unfold once in a lifetime or manifest repeatedly? This inquiry demands perpetual contemplation, particularly during the Advent season, providing insights that reverberate throughout the year. Unfortunately, the prevailing darkness in our world often veils the clarity of this question's answer. The symbolic illumination of Advent candles serves as a metaphorical act of dispelling darkness, a preparatory ritual for recognizing the light that triumphs over all shadows – the Messiah, celebrated in the jubilance of Christmas. He, the luminous beacon, surpasses natural light, radiating brilliance upon the world. Advent, therefore, becomes a sacred interval for allowing His light to magnify within us.

Houselander further imparts wisdom, delineating Advent as the season of secrets – the clandestine growth of Christ, the silent maturation of Divine Love. It embodies humility, silence, and an intimate journey of nurturing. In parallel to Christ's nine months of gestation, wherein he took form within his mother's womb, Houselander urges reflection on the profound concept that we, as the body of Christ, should consider what that truly entails. Advent emerges as the opportune occasion to awaken our consciousness to His incarnation among us and to anticipate His glorious return. In the spirit of vigilance, as advocated by Jesus, the admonition "Watch!" becomes a resounding call during Advent, urging us not to be found slumbering when He returns.

In the art of "Watching," our preparatory endeavors for Advent should mirror the exquisite model set by Mary. It beckons us to participate in His arrival by creating space within ourselves. Through humility, reverence, and the profound silence of Advent, we gain a genuine encounter with His presence – not only among us but within the depths of our beings. Advent, thus, transcends a mere countdown to Christmas; it becomes our active engagement with the mystery of His incarnation, a sacred journey towards embodying the essence of Christ within us.
