



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION:

Today's Gospel is full of stewardship advice: give to everyone who asks; expect nothing in return; do not judge or condemn; love your enemies. Live your life with great kindness and mercy! Jesus offers a very challenging, seemingly impossible approach to daily life. It makes one want to say, "Seriously, Lord?" And he doesn't stop there. Jesus adds, "Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back.'"

It seems so unfair! That is, unless we look at this way of life as a steward. Then, not only does it seem doable (though challenging), but it also actually makes sense. God has entrusted all things to each of us in love for His purpose and glory. Jesus is simply asking that we also approach others, and the sharing of our gifts with the same attitude. FAMILIES AND THE GOSPEL February 20, 2022: Seventh Sunday (LK 6:27-38)

In studying the effects of religion upon family relationships, researchers inform us hostility and prayer can't coexist. You cannot be hostile toward someone for whom you are praying. Today's gospel encourages us: "Bless those who curse you. Pray for those who treat you badly."

LOVE AS GOD LOVES

Our Gospel today continues Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, in which we heard Luke's version of the Beatitudes. This week, Jesus gives us new "commandments," telling us how to live and act in the world as his disciples, rooted in the radical love of God for humanity. It reminds us of his later speech about loving one another as he loves us, in other words with a God-like love, the kind we see in today's psalm about God's mercy. How else could we do as Jesus tells us by loving our enemies, which seems impossible, until we remember that God gave us the example of Jesus, who is like God but also like us? David understands this merciful love when he spares the life of his enemy in the first reading. Finally, Paul tells us that we will become like Jesus if we act as he did, as God does.
