GESTURES AT MASS

As Catholics, we go through a number of gestures during the course of the Mass.

We genuflect as we come into and leave church, we bow before reception of Communion or when crossing in front of the altar, we kneel during Consecration. We sit to listen to some of the readings and homily, but we stand for the proclamation of the Gospel. Why all these postures and what is their importance?

Genuflecting—

As far back as ancient times, people genuflected on one knee or bowed before the king as a sign of respect and to pledge their allegiance to him. As Catholics, we proclaim Jesus as the King of

Heaven and Earth. When we enter the church, before going into our pew, we acknowledge Jesus' presence in the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle by reverently genuflecting on our right knee or making a simple bow if we cannot genuflect. We face the tabernacle while doing this to show our Lord that we know he is truly present there. A Catholic Church is not like other gathering spaces. It is a quiet place of prayer and worship, filled with the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. So, when you go to Mass next weekend, remember that you are not entering an auditorium, a theater, or a gymnasium. You are entering a sacred space where you have a unique opportunity to spend person-to-person time with Jesus in the Eucharist. Show your love for Him by reverently genuflecting when you enter and leave this sacred place.

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1 Kings 3: 5, 7-12 King Solomon ruled about 950 years before Christ. His wisdom was legendary. Today's reading describes an event from early in Solomon's rule that tells how he became a wise person.

Romans 8: 28-30 As we continue reading from the eighth chapter of Paul's letter to the Romans, we will hear Paul use the word predestined. This word does not mean that individuals are locked into a destiny over which they have no control. Rather, it means that in Christ, God provides abundant grace for everyone.

When I was a teenager, after a homecoming dance one year I took my date for a walk on the Potomac in downtown Alexandria. The moon was out and I was struck by how the light shimmered on the water. I remember focusing to try to see all the details of the dancing rays on the ripples. My date didn't see it and didn't really get it. She thought it was no big deal. It was a great date and a fun night, but for that one moment we saw the world from two completely different vantage points.

Two of the greatest gifts from God to each of us are life and time. Without taking care, we can easily miss the grandeur and beauty of both. Being mindful as an everyday steward means pausing to see the detail in all that exists around us. God's creation is not something created with a broad brush, but instead with the intricacies of a master painter.

God created all things with purpose and a complexity only the divine could fully comprehend. Every single hair on our head has been counted! But when we take a moment to reflect on the beauty that is created by that complexity, we allow ourselves to revel in God's generosity. There is so much to give thanks for in this life. But you and I can't give thanks to God unless we really stop to take notice. When was the last time you stared in awe at the moon?
