One of the most powerful ways to enter into the Passion and death of Jesus is to pray the pious devotion we call the Stations of the Cross. The custom of walking and praying the Stations of the Cross was used in the fifteenth century. Pilgrims to the Holy Land developed a custom of visiting the places sanctified by Christ's early life, particularly the path he took on Good Friday from His trial at Pilate's house to Golgotha, where He was crucified, and then on to the tomb of Joseph of Arimathea.

Praying the Stations of the Cross is a powerful way to contemplate and enter into the mystery of Jesus' gift of Himself to us. In praying the stations of the Cross, we come to experience the love Jesus has for us as His faithful followers and for each one of us individually as we draw ourselves closer to Him through developing a deeper love and appreciation for His gift of salvation for us all.

You can walk that pilgrimage of Jesus' final journey as He carried His cross to Golgotha, the place of His crucifixion, every Friday evening at 6:00 in the Church.

# The Four Cups of Wine

Wine has been a traditional aspect of the Passover Seder for thousands of years. Matthew, Mark, and Luke indicate the Last Supper was a Passover meal that Jesus had with His disciples where wine took on the symbolism of Jesus's own covenant blood. At a traditional Passover Seder, each participant drinks four cups of wine or grape juice. The four cups remind us of the four expressions of redemption mentioned in Exodus 6:6-7.

- 1. I will bring you out from under the oppression of the Egyptians.
- 2. I will deliver you from slavery to them.
- 3. I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with mighty acts of judgement.
- 4. I will take you to be my people.

# **CEMETERY REGULATIONS (Part 2)**

It has been suggested that we publish the regulations governing our cemeteries to avoid misunderstandings. This is the second part:

#### BUYERS' RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. The purchase of a Burial Privilege Certificate, whether in a grave or a crypt, does not acquire title to the property itself.
- 2. Plots or graves are for family use; they may not be sold for profit by holders of Burial Privilege Certificates.
- 3. Plot holders are to keep St. Joseph Parish informed of their current address. The address on file will be considered the legal address for notices pertaining to the cemetery plot.
- 4. In the event of the death of a plot holder, all privileges in the plot shall pass to the spouse; then to those named or designated in instructions left for the cemetery or in the will; then to those chosen by a joint decision of the legal heirs; finally, to those designated according to the Pennsylvania law of intestacy. A new Burial Privilege Certificate is to be issued in all instances by St. Joseph Parish.
- 5. St. Joseph Parish may, at its discretion, repurchase plots, graves, or crypts at original cost minus any outstanding expenses. Any transfer of ownership rights must be made by St. Joseph Parish.
- 6. All Cemetery Rules and Regulations apply also to mausoleums.
- 7. St. Joseph Parish reserves the right to make improvements to the cemetery at all times.
- 8. In all matters not herein specifically covered, St. Joseph Parish shall have the right to determine and decide any and all questions that shall arise.
- 9. All inquiries and business concerning the cemetery are to be made in writing or by appointment only.
- 10. Perpetual care includes filling in sunken graves, seeding, cutting grass, and trimming around memorials. Care does not include placement, maintenance or repair of any monuments or the planting of flowers or ornamental plants on specific plots.

### **SEEING THE LIGHT**

Our Lenten journey continues this Sunday as we hear of Jesus healing a blind man in the Gospel of John. Jesus proclaims himself the light of the world, a light that overcomes darkness and enables a new capacity to see. The man, blind from birth, was able to begin his path to sight by first acknowledging his blindness. We are reminded of God's ongoing invitation to us to journey from blindness to sight. We begin by acknowledging our own capacity for "blind spots," and so open ourselves to uncomfortable truths and to God's healing. We are invited to see beyond appearances, as the reading from Samuel indicates, and to look into the heart of things. We are invited to "live as children of light" as the letter to the Ephesians teaches. Like the man healed from blindness, we may gradually learn to see fully and to follow Jesus.
