CEMETERY REGULATIONS Part 3

To avoid misunderstandings, it has been suggested that we publish the regulations governing our cemeteries. This is the third part:

INTERMENTS

- 1. All interments must be in accord with Church Law. No symbols or ceremonies, religious or otherwise, may be used or performed that would be against Christian principles.
- 2. The sacred ground of a Catholic cemetery is intended for Catholic burial only. We have the right to refuse burial to those who are not practicing Catholics. The Church explicitly permits non-Catholics to be buried with their spouses.
- 3. No graves may be opened for the interment of corporal remains or cremains without permission from the parish office.
- 4. St. Joseph Parish may refuse to open a grave or permit the placement of a memorial when:
 - just debts are not paid [e.g., unpaid balance on a plot, annual plot care, or perpetual care];
 - or when there is a question of ownership of the plot.

Where was the Last Supper held?

Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and make preparations for us to eat the Passover. [...] As you enter the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. [...] He will show you a large room upstairs, all furnished. Make preparations there." (Luke 22:7–12)

This two-story stone building atop Mount Zion ranks among the most intriguing sites in Jerusalem. It is traditionally called the Cenacle (from the Latin coenaculum, "dining-room") and you will find it just outside the present-day Old City walls to the south. The building's lower story has been associated since the Middle Ages with the Tomb of David, while the upper story often referred to in English as the "Upper Room"—is traditionally believed to be the place of Jesus' last supper.

MONDAY, MARCH 27th is the last day to purchase Seder Meal tickets.

St. Joseph's Seder Meal will be held on Palm Sunday, April 2nd at the Church Hall with hors d'oeuvres at 4:00 pm and dinner at 4:30 pm. Tickets are now on sale at the parish office or after Mass - \$5 for one / \$15 for a family. Participants are also asked to bring a side dish to share during the regular meal.

LIFE FROM GOD

As we approach Holy Week, our readings speak of a God who, in the midst of death, brings new life to the people. In Ezekiel, we hear that God will open the graves of the people of Israel, who faced near extinction. In the Gospel of John, Jesus gives new life to Lazarus in a manner that prefigures the resurrection of Jesus. Paul tells the Romans that in Christ, God will not only give life to our bodies after death, but God offers us abundant life here and now. We observe that the external conditions for the people described in these readings did not radically change. Israel was still in exile. Lazarus would eventually face death again. But now God's presence and power are revealed. Even when our situation in life is difficult and perhaps not likely to change soon, we remember that the Spirit dwells within us.

CATHOLIC PRAYER CORNER Prayer Before a Crucifix

Look down upon me, good and gentle Jesus while before your face I humbly kneel, and with burning soul pray and beseech you to fix deep in my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope, and charity; true contrition for my sins, and a firm purpose of amendment. While I contemplate with great love and pity, your five most precious wounds, pondering over them within me, I call to mind the words which David, your prophet, said of you, my good Jesus:

"They have pierced my hands and my feet,

they have numbered all my bones."
