#### IHE SHKUUD OF TUKIN

TALK AND REPLICA is COMING TO Holy Spirit Parish St. Agnes Church Sunday, March 26, 2023, at 3:00 PM. Don't miss this excellent opportunity to experience the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ in a way that can make this an unforgettable event in your life. Considered one of the greatest mysteries of our time, the Shroud of Turin continues to amaze and baffle scientists, doctors, historians, artists, and theologians. Scientists cannot explain the source of the image, which contains photographic and 3-D properties on an ancient cloth. But is this the actual burial cloth of Jesus Christ? Bill Wingard, a speaker for the Shroud, will

present the case for authenticity that has already been delivered on the east and west coasts, and you can be the judge. Come see a full-size replica of the Shroud and the photographic negative images that sparked an explosion of scientific interest and debate over a century ago which continues to this day. What message does the Shroud have for each of us? Bring others, including teens on up and your cameras.

Just a reminder that all Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. FASTING refers to only one full meal, with two small meals and no eating otherwise for the day. ABSTINENCE refers to not eating meat at all throughout the day. All those who have reached their 14th year are obliged to ABSTAIN. The Church directs the holy FAST to all until their 60th birthday. (Canon 1252).

## The Last Supper

During the Last Supper Jesus speaks of the Passover with His disciples. He picks up the bread and says "eat of it; this is my flesh." He picks up the wine and says "drink of this; this is the blood of a new covenant." Something big is about to happen—something bigger than ever before. Redemption is coming in a way that will be similar to the first Passover, but its impact will be far greater.

This new, greater Exodus won't produce redemption from slavery from Egypt, It will produce redemption from slavery to sin and freedom from the oppressive forces of death, and the things that hold our hearts captive and separate us from God.

Passover is a festival of freedom. For Christians, it is not simply a story about a people long ago who made their Exodus from Egypt. It is a story about a people making a greater Exodus from the oppressive powers of death and slavery to sin. It is the story of a lamb that entered the battle against the greatest evil and was victorious as if a lion had entered the battlefield (Rev 5:5-6).

St. Joseph's Seder Meal will be held on Palm Sunday, April 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Church Hall with hors d'oeuvres at 4:00 pm and dinner at 4:30 pm. Tickets are now on sale at the parish office or after Mass - \$5 for one / \$15 for a family. Participants are also asked to bring a side dish to share during the regular meal.


## **TURNING POINTS**

Our readings today describe turning points for those whom God has chosen. In Genesis, God calls Abram to leave his homeland, with the promise of forming a people in a new land. In the Gospel, the disciples see Jesus literally in a new light, the bright light of Jesus' transfiguration. They begin to see Jesus, and themselves, in a new way. These are times when God presents a new way forward, providing new purpose and energy. Our lives too have their own turning points, where God is working (usually in less spectacular fashion) to lead us into fuller maturity, and into deeper unity with God and others. The road ahead, as with Abram, Jesus, and the disciples, may be long and difficult.
