MILITARY CHAPLAINS

All branches of the U.S. military have ordained clergy, commissioned officers and enlisted personnel from all faiths and creeds, who provide ongoing spiritual and emotional care to troops and their families. Chaplains may be found both at a base or in the fields of battle. They go wherever the soldiers go. Since the Civil War, 419 chaplains of all religious faiths have died in the line of duty, either on the field of battle, a military hospital, or in a POW camp. The first chaplain to die in action was Emmeran Bliemel, a Catholic priest serving Tennessee soldiers in the Civil War, killed under fire in August 1864 while giving final absolution to a dying Confederate colonel at the Battle of Jonesboro, Georgia. Over the years, nine chaplains have been awarded the nation's highest military recognition, the Medal of Honor. Five of the nine were Catholic priests.



Jesus gives us this mission in our Gospel passage from John, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." But we must not let this responsibility overwhelm us. Jesus Himself, tells us "Peace be with you." As this Easter season comes to a close, let us be at peace. INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS PENTECOST SUNDAY

Acts 2: 1-11 Pentecost was a Jewish feast that celebrated the beginning of the harvest. It took place 50 days after the feast of Passover. Jewish pilgrims came to Jerusalem from all over the ancient world for the celebration. Today we hear how Pentecost became a Christian feast. 1 Corinthians 12: 3-7, 12-13 Paul's first letter to the Corinthians responds to a letter they wrote to him, asking how to deal with the diversity of gifts in the community, and the rivalries and jealousies that inevitably arose. In today's passage, he uses a comparison that we will recognize immediately.
