

BEATIFICATION

Beatification is a stage in the Roman Catholic Church towards canonization or sainthood. Those beatified are declared "blessed" and worthy of public veneration. Last Sunday, a beatification Mass service was held in Poland for the Ulma family, a Catholic family of nine murdered by Nazis for hiding Jews during World War II.

This was the first time an entire family has been beatified, a great honor and a step towards sainthood. In late 1942, motivated by their Christian values, farmers Jozef and Wiktoria Ulma and their six young children hid eight Jews in their farmhouse in the village of Markowa. The Nazis discovered the Jewish people hiding on the Ulma farm and executed them. The Nazi police then killed 31-year-old Wiktoria, who was pregnant and in premature labor (the child was actually born during the horror of the killings and received "baptism by blood" of its martyred mother), and 44-year-old Józef outside their home. An additional order sealed the fate of the remaining family members: "Kill the children, too." Stanisława, 7, Barbara, 6, Władysław, 5, Franciszek, almost 4, Antoni, 2, and Maria, 1, were executed.

The Hateful Things We Hug Tight

At the end of "Lord of the Rings: Return of the King," Gollum fghts with Frodo for possession of the One Ring. He wins the fght, but in doing so topples over the edge of the mountain ledge, falling into the cavernous fres of Mount Doom. As he falls, we see him smile, and clutch the ring to his chest. He is happy. He has won what he spent his life pursuing. It is only in the last millisecond before his face slips below the lava that we see his eyes widen in terror as he realizes the truth: the thing he clutches to his heart is the thing that killed him. In choosing the ring, he chooses death. Sin, and the fallen nature of this world, makes us addicted to something that kills us. Like any addiction, it is a vicious cycle. The less we forgive, the more hardhearted we become ... and the less we seek forgiveness ourselves. What breaks the cycle? Reconciliation with God — or, Confession, as we call it. In fact, it does more than break the cycle. It turns it backward. Not only does it detoxify our souls of sin, it weakens our addiction to sin's effects — anger, vengeance, unforgiveness. The confession of evil works is the frst beginning of good works, said St. Augustine. Ultimately, I view our whole human life as a struggle on the ledge of a mountaintop. It is certain that we will choose sin — we always do. We will tumble over the side, toward ruin. But let us be Frodo, and not Gollum. Let us cling to the rock of the sacraments and accept the hand that would drag us away from the fames. "Wrath and anger are hateful things, yet the sinner hugs them tight." — Sirach 27:30
